Our parish staff is here to serve you and your family during this time of grief. Please let us know if we can help in any way.



Things to Consider

Placement of Pall on coffin

Upon entering the church at the Baptismal Font, a white cloth called a Pall will be placed on the coffin which symbolizes our Baptism. A close family member, siblings, children or the pall bearers are encouraged to participate.

When Cremains are present

If your loved one has been cremated, their remains are usually placed in an urn. When your family arrives at church with the urn, place the urn on the table in front of the altar. You may place a picture of your loved one and/or a vase of flowers on the table with the cremains.

Readings & Responsorial Psalm - Please choose one from each section.

First Reading is from the Old Testament – pages 6-12

Psalm Response – pages 13-24

Second Reading is from the New Testament – pages 25-32

Gospel from Matthew, Mark, Luke, John or The Acts of the Apostles – pages 33-42 (Read by priest or deacon only)

This is an opportunity for family members or friends to participate in the Mass. One person may be chosen to proclaim the First and Second Readings or one person per reading. (Does not include reading the Gospel) If you do not have someone comfortable reading at Mass, a Bereavement Minister can proclaim the readings.

Universal Prayer / General Intercessions

Found on pages 43-44

This is an opportunity for family members or friends to participate in the Mass.

If you do not have someone comfortable reading at Mass, please be assured the priest or deacon will proclaim the Intercessions.

Presentation of the Gifts

An opportunity for 2 people to participate in the Mass, bringing the common elements of bread and wine to the priest for consecration into the Body and Blood of Christ. See pg. 47 to place names on the mass outline.

Eulogy

We encourage eulogies to take place at the wake, funeral luncheon, or at the graveside. With exception, they are allowed at Notre Dame. They should be 3-5 minutes in length; be written, and submitted to the Parish prior to the Mass. Please contact your bereavement Minister.

Brothers and sisters:

we were reconciled to God through the death of his Son, how much more, once reconciled, will we be saved by his life?

Brothers and sisters:

Are you unaware that we who were baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death?

We were indeed buried with him through baptism into death, so that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might live in newness of life.

For if we have grown into union with him through a death like his, we shall also be united with him in the resurrection.

We know that our old self was crucified with him, so that our sinful body might be done away with, that we might no longer be in slavery to sin.

For a dead person has been absolved from sin.

If, then, we have died with Christ,

we believe that we shall also live with him.

We know that Christ, raised from the dead, dies no more; death no longer has power over him.

nor any other creature will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord.

Brothers and sisters:

Behold, I tell you a mystery.

We shall not all fall asleep, but we will all be changed, in an instant, in the blink of an eye, at the last trumpet.

For the trumpet will sound,

the dead will be raised incorruptible, and we shall be changed.

For that which is corruptible must clothe itself with incorruptibility, and that which is mortal must clothe itself with immortality.

And when this which is corruptible clothes itself with incorruptibility and this which is mortal clothes itself with immortality, then the word that is written shall come about:

Death is swallowed up in victory.

Where, O death, is your victory?
