Choices and Decisions

Placement of Pall on coffin

Upon entering the church at the Baptismal Font, a white cloth called a Pall will be placed on the coffin which symbolizes our Baptism. A close family member, siblings, children or the pall bearers are encouraged to participate by placing the pall on the casket, with assistance from the Funeral Director.

When Cremains are present

If your loved one has been cremated, their remains are placed in an urn. When your family arrives at church with the urn, place the urn on the table in front of the altar. You may place a picture of your loved one and/or a vase of flowers on the table with the cremains.

Readings & Responsorial Psalm - *choose one from each section.*

First Reading is from the Old Testament – pages 6-12

Psalm Response – pages 13-23 (*Sung by Cantor only – not spoken*)

Second Reading is from the New Testament – pages 24-31

Gospel from Matthew, Mark, Luke, John or The Acts of the Apostles – pages 32-41

(Read by priest or deacon only)

One person may be chosen to proclaim both the First and Second Readings or one person per reading.

If you do not have someone comfortable reading at Mass, a Bereavement Minister may proclaim both readings.

Universal Prayer (also known as General Intercessions) found on pages 42-45

This is another opportunity for family members or friends to participate in the Mass. If you do not have someone comfortable reading at Mass, the priest or deacon will proclaim the Intercessions.

Presentation of the Gifts

Another opportunity for 2 people to participate in the Mass by bringing the common elements of bread and wine to the priest for consecration into the Body and Blood of Christ. See pg.50 to place names on the mass outline.

Eulogy

Eulogies are best given at the wake, funeral luncheon, or at the graveside. With exception, they are allowed at Notre Dame. They should be 3-5 minutes in length; be written, and must be submitted to the Parish for approval by the Pastor prior to the Mass. Please contact your bereavement Minister.

Music

Song selections for the Gathering, Psalm, Preparation of Gifts, Communion, Final Commendation and Closing, along with links for listening, are on pages 46-48.

The Mass planning sheet is on pgs. 49-50; record your choices on these pages and give the completed form to the church office prior to the actual day of the Mass.

NT - 1 Romans 5:5-11

A reading from the Letter of Saint Paul to the Romans

Brothers and sisters:

Hope does not disappoint,
because the love of God has been poured out into our hearts

A reading from the Letter of Saint Paul to the Romans

Brothers and sisters:

*Are you unaware that we who were baptized into Christ Jesus
were baptized into his death?*

*We were indeed buried with him through baptism into death, so that,
just as Christ was raised from the dead
by the glory of the Father,
we too might live in newness of life.*

For if we have grown into union with him through a death like his,
we shall also be united with him in the resurrection.

We know that our old self was crucified with him,
so that our sinful body might be done away with,
that we might no longer be in slavery to sin.

For a dead person has been absolved from sin.

*If, then, we have died with Christ,
we believe that we shall also live with him.*

*We know that Christ, raised from the dead, dies no more;
death no longer has power over him.*

It is God who acquits us.

Who will condemn?

It is Christ Jesus who died, rather, was raised,

What will separate us from the love of Christ?

Will anguish, or distress or persecution, or famine,

or nakedness, or peril, or the sword?

No, in all these things we conquer overwhelmingly through him who loved us.

For I am convinced that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor principalities,

nor present things, nor future things,

nor powers, nor height, nor depth,

nor any other creature will be able to separate us from the love of God

in Christ Jesus our Lord.

NT - 4 1 Corinthians 15:51-57

A reading from the first Letter of Saint Paul to the Corinthians

Brothers and sisters:

Behold, I tell you a mystery.

We shall not all fall asleep, but we will all be changed,
in an instant, in the blink of an eye, at the last trumpet.

For the trumpet will sound,
the dead will be raised incorruptible, and we shall be changed.

For that which is corruptible must clothe itself with incorruptibility,
and that which is mortal must clothe itself with immortality.

And when this which is corruptible clothes itself with incorruptibility
and this which is mortal clothes itself with immortality,
then the word that is written shall come about:

Death is swallowed up in victory.

Where, O death, is your victory?

Where, O death, is your sting?

The sting of death is sin,
and the power of sin is the law.

But thanks be to God who gives us the victory
through our Lord Jesus Christ.

that is also yours in Christ Jesus,
Who, though he was in the form of God,
did not regard equality with God
something to be grasped.

Rather, he emptied himself,
taking the form of a slave,
coming in human likeness;
and found human in appearance,
he humbled himself,
becoming obedient to death,
even death on a cross.

Because of this, God greatly exalted him
and bestowed on him
the name that is above every name,
that at the name of Jesus every knee should bend,
of those in heaven and on earth
and under the earth,
and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ
is Lord to the glory of God, the Father.

bring with him those who have fallen asleep.

Indeed, we tell you this, on the word of the Lord, that we who are alive,
who are left until the coming of the Lord,
will surely not precede those who have fallen asleep.

For the Lord himself, with a word of command,
with the voice of an archangel and with the trumpet of God,
will come down from heaven,
and the dead in Christ will rise first.

Then we who are alive, who are left,
will be caught up together with them in the clouds
to meet the Lord in the air.

Thus, we shall always be with the Lord.

Therefore, console one another with these words.
